

GENERAL PORTFOLIO INFORMATION

The Portfolio is used to help determine project achievement winners on the Senior Level in Tennessee 4-H.

A county may enter three books in each Level of Leadership and Citizenship (12 books), and three in each level for each of the Roundup projects.

Citizenship and Leadership:

State winners in these two projects are named at State 4-H Congress. The top five portfolio scores in each level win a trip to Congress to compete in this contest. These Contests are divided into two levels: Level I (9th and 10th grade) and Level II (11th and 12th grade).

Level I: 4-H members' portfolios will count 50% and their interview will count 50% of their total score. The members interview must contain a visual element such as poster, small exhibit, etc.

Level II: 4-H members' portfolios will count 75% and their interview will count 25% of their total score. There is no visual element in this interview.

Due Dates: These portfolios are due in the State 4-H Office in February (check current Region calendar for exact date).

Awards: Level I winners will receive a \$500 scholarship
Level II winners receive a \$1000 scholarship and a trip to National 4-H Congress.

All other projects: State winners in all other projects will be determined at State 4-H Roundup. These projects are:
