

STATE 4-H COUNCIL

The State 4-H Council includes:

- Junior and Senior Representatives
- Representatives-at-Large
- State 4-H All-Star Officers
- State 4-H Congress Officers
- President of TAE4-HW (adult position)
- President of Tennessee 4-H Alumni Inc. (adult position)
- Chairman of State Committee of 4-H Volunteer Leaders (adult position)
- President of Tennessee 4-H Foundation (adult position)

A person may only hold one position on the State 4-H Council at a time.

Senior Representatives

To be elected as a Senior Representative, a member must attend Tennessee 4-H Roundup and be nominated and elected by his/her Region to this position. Each Region can elect two Senior Representatives annually. One of these will serve as the regional nominee for State Council President and the other as the regional candidate for State Council Vice President. If the regional candidate for State 4-H Council President is elected, then they can move an alternate Senior Representative up to an additional spot on the State 4-H Council.

Junior Representatives

To be elected as a Junior Representative, a member must attend Tennessee 4-H Roundup and be nominated and elected by his/her Region to this position. Each region can elect a minimum of two Junior Representatives. If the Region's senior high enrollment (9th through 12th grade) exceeds 5,000 on October 1, of the previous year, an additional junior representative may be elected, not to exceed a maximum of three junior representatives from any one Region.

Representatives-at-Large

The two Representatives-at-Large shall be appointed by the Dean of UT Extension. The Representatives-at-Large shall be in the tenth or eleventh school grade as of January 1 of the current year and shall hold membership in the Tennessee 4-H Honor Club. These offices are chosen via an interview process at State 4-H Roundup.

State 4-H Council President

The President shall be elected from the three regional nominees for President by secret ballot by the delegates to State 4-H Roundup. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected President. He/she shall be in the eleventh grade as of January 1 of the current year and shall hold membership in the Tennessee 4-H Honor Club. They shall take office at the end of Roundup.

State 4-H Council Vice-President

The Vice-President shall be elected from the three regional nominees for Vice-President by secret ballot by the delegates to State 4-H Roundup. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected Vice-President. He/she shall be in the eleventh grade as of January 1 of the current year and shall hold membership in the Tennessee 4-H Honor Club. They shall take office at the end of Roundup.

State 4-H Council Secretary

This officer is elected by the State Council to serve in this capacity.
