

TENNESSEE 4-H ROUNDUP

Tennessee 4-H Roundup serves as the forum to crown State Senior Achievement winners in all projects except Citizenship and Leadership (which are crowned at State Congress). It also serves as State All-Star Conference. Members will also take part in College and Career related workshops and activities. The Vol-State Initiation Ceremony also takes place at Roundup.

Date

This event is usually held the third full week of July. Please check Region calendar for the exact date.

Location

Roundup rotates between the University of Tennessee at Knoxville and the University of Tennessee at Martin. It rotates ever 2 years to Martin. Please check Region calendar for current location.

Eligibility

To win a Roundup Scholarship, Senior 4-H members must place in the top 5 in their respective project areas of their age division. This is done by submitting a project record book in one of the following areas (see also Portfolios and Competiton):
